Category	Restrictions
Social gathering	• from 6 pm tonight private gatherings in the home will be limited to five visitors per day, public gatherings will be limited to 30 people
Face masks	• The face mask requirement applies to everyone aged 12 years and older.
Places of worship	 The government will pause a move to lift the density quotient in outdoor spaces and venues to a maximum of 200 people in spaces smaller than 400 sq m. This was due on 28/05/2021 There will be no changes to the existing density quote for weddings and funerals held at venues, but if they are being held at a private residence, they will be subject to the new restrictions No changes to the number of people attending church gatherings, i.e. on Sabbath mornings.
Schools	 Children in primary schools do not have to wear masks but teachers will need to wear a mask. Secondary school students need to wear masks. Social gathering/ Activities: No clear direction yet. Recommended to have Maximum up to 30 if school events have/include visitors (parents and others)
Regional travel	• No restrictions on travelling to regional areas, however, you need to observe the above-mentioned restrictions.
