Vaccination Requirements	Patrons (members, customers, clients) will no longer need to show vaccination status at the following venues:	
	 Non-essential retail, except for hair and beauty Real estate inspections and auctions Places of worship Wedding and funerals unless the venue where the wedding or funeral is held still has a vaccination mandate, e.g., hospitality venues 	 Workers at these venues still must be vaccinated. i.e. authorised workers. If the ceremony (religious ceremonies) is at a hospitality setting, vaccine requirements will apply.
	 Vaccination mandate will now apply to those 18 years and over, not from 12 years and over. 	
Masks	 Masks remain in indoor retail and the other high- risk settings like hospitals and aged care. Masks will no longer need to be worn at weddings, funerals, or ceremonial settings. 	

Cleaning	 There will no longer be cleaning requirements in workplaces 	This is due to mounting international evidence that coronavirus is an airborne or droplet-borne disease and the likelihood of becoming infected by touching a surface is very low risk.
Hospitality	• Under the pandemic orders, restaurants, cafes are still only open to fully vaccinated patrons and staff. Workers are required to wear masks.	This is applied to ADRA community meals and churches providing similar services. The only exception is where vaccination status is not checked, a cap of maximum 50 patrons is required.

What does this mean for places of worship?

- No cap requirement
- No vaccination verification required for members (Authorised workers still required to be vaccinated.)
- No mask requirements
