# A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



## **CALLED TO DO GOOD**

Our world currently appears to be teetering on the precipice of crisis. At the click of a mouse or the flick of a finger, many predict our imminent demise due to climate change, conflict, AI, or some other catastrophe. It is easy to feel overwhelmed and want to withdraw from the world. Running away from the world will only bring temporary relief at best. Change will come for us, even if we don't look for it. Even as I write this, it is a signal of change for the Adventist Church in Victoria, as personnel changes take effect.

Jesus challenges us to stand tall as the coming of Christ comes closer (Luke 21:28). The path of courage is the one that Jesus took. He was willing to make a difference, even at great cost to Himself.

Isaiah reluctantly became God's prophet to Israel at a time when the nation was facing steep decline. A rising superpower to its north was intent on their destruction, and rapid change was upon them. Their religion had become an empty husk of meaningless ritual. God's "children" no longer knew Him, nor understood Him. God's pain at his people's waywardness is revealed in Isaiah 1.

God's message was a call to turn back to God, to learn to do right. God wanted his people to know that He is the one who takes our worst sins and washes us clean. When we are cleansed, we are released to do good, as we imitate Christ.

Let's be people who make a difference for God, and for good. It might mean taking a stand against abuse at an enditnow® rally, because we are all made in the image of God. It might be serving the community at a STORMCo, because Jesus came to serve. It might be finding new ways to share the gospel from your local church, because Jesus instructs us to take the gospel to all the world. Let's pray for trust in God that will enable us to stand tall for Him no matter what.

# 'BREAKING THE SILENCE': ENDITNOW RALLIES 2025

**"LEARN TO DO GOOD; SEEK JUSTICE,  
CORRECT OPPRESSION; BRING  
JUSTICE TO THE FATHERLESS, AND  
PLEASE THE WIDOW'S CAUSE."**

**- ISAIAH 1:17**

On the Sabbath of August 23, Burwood Church and Bairnsdale Church hosted enditnow® rallies advocating for the end of violence and abuse—a momentous event, as this was the first time two rallies had been held simultaneously across the state.

**enditnow® is a global movement from the Seventh-day Adventist Church, launched with Women's, Children's, and Family Ministries, dedicated to ending abuse in all its forms—physical, emotional, spiritual, and sexual. Since 2009, enditnow® has been the boldest stance the Adventist Church has taken against abuse. Now active in over 200 countries and territories, this initiative invites everyone—Adventists or not—to stand for dignity, safety, and healing.**

The Victorian Conference's Women's Ministry department, Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA), and the Children and Family Ministries department, worked together to organise the Burwood rally, and then further collaborated with dedicated pastor and counsellor Faye Stothers-Khan to hold a rally in Bairnsdale.

Pr Tarnya Garner, director of Women's Ministries for the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Victoria, said, "At the heart of both gatherings are women of conviction and courage—women who believe deeply in fairness, equality and the well-being of people in every stage of life: men and women, children and the elderly alike."

"Our message is clear and unwavering: No-one should ever be subjected to disrespect, harm or violence. The enditnow® initiative stands for love, encouragement and transformation—and stands firmly against all forms of abuse. For those who have endured such pain, their greatest wish is that no-one else should have to

experience it. That is why these rallies are not only about raising awareness, but also about prevention, education and inspiring change."

Across both rallies, sixty 'Go Bags' were collected to support people experiencing domestic violence. These 'Go Bags' contained donations of essential items, including but not limited to sanitary products, facial/body wipes, and oral care.

During the Burwood Rally keynote presentation, AUC Women's Ministries and Resource Development Director, Sylvia Mendez, championed the Union's new resources to aid and advocate for victims in need of help, as well as resources for local churches and communities.

Post rally, Rebecca Auriant, ADRA Director for the Victorian Conference, shared the AUC's teen resource 'Breaking the Silence: Teen Edition' to Year 11 and 12 students at Heritage College. The session emphasised the guide's process of 'Listen. Believe. Refer' during discussions around support strategies for victims of family and domestic violence.

# Church celebrates opening of Haskell Hall and the 140th Anniversary of the Adventist Church in Australia

On April 6, 2025, church officers, members and friends of the Victorian Conference were joined by dignitaries from the South Pacific Division, Australian Union Conference, Trans-Pacific Union, and local government to open 'Haskell Hall' - a new 340-seat multi-purpose auditorium on the Nunawading Estate (former camp ground). The facility was officially opened by Pr Glenn Townend, President of the South Pacific Division.

Built as part of Stage 3 of the Pavilions Blackburn Lake retirement village project, this new state-of-the-art multi-purpose facility has been designed to provide event, conferencing, and extensive congregational worship capabilities to the Victorian Conference, as well as performing arts capabilities and social event amenities to Pavilions residents and the wider community.

Named after Elder Stephen N. Haskell - the superintendent in charge of the mission that brought Seventh-day Adventist beliefs to Australia in 1885, Haskell Halls' development was in response to the desire expressed by the 2009 Constituency Meeting for a church building to be part of the overall Nunawading Estate development.

Located on the exact site of the 'Big Tent' when Big Camp was held in Nunawading, Haskell Hall's positioning is a remembrance of the site's Adventist heritage and an acknowledgement of the memories and long legacy of fellowship and service conducted by generations of Adventist members on the site. It is noted that when ground excavations commenced, builders found thousands of tent pegs, left by generations of Adventist campers.

Construction was completed in April 2025 and was completed under budget, ahead of schedule, and fully funded from the proceeds of the Pavilions' development.

Also celebrating the 140th anniversary of the Church in Australia, Pr Graeme Christian shared the story of how

John Corliss evangelised Melbourne, and after much hard work and prayer, established the first Seventh-day Adventist congregation in Australia (and the southern hemisphere) in North Fitzroy in 1886.

Galen Gan, project lead, says, "It is fitting that this Hall has been completed in time to commemorate 140 years of Adventist faith in Australia - ready to play its part as an enduring asset to the Victorian Church into the future."

## Interior Design: RENEW Women's Conference 2025

## 'Service to Others Really Matters': A STORMCo Revival

For more than 30 years, STORMCo (Service to Others Really Matters) has been impacting communities across Australia. The initiative sends youth teams to visit communities and "present Christian faith in action by building long-term relationships and being a refreshing influence to the entire community" ([stormco.org.au](http://stormco.org.au)).

Once a thriving youth ministry activity in Victoria, STORMCo has experienced a downturn following the COVID-19 pandemic. This year, we were excited to see the youth of Geelong Seventh-day Adventist Church head to Warrnambool and the Carrum Downs Pathfinder Club to Bairnsdale to serve in each community.

With two new groups launching this year, our hope is that this will spark a movement of youth teams committed to being the hands and feet of Jesus through service projects.

Shantaya Lewis, a member of Geelong Church, and Kennedy Su'a, a member of the Carrum Down Pathfinder Club, share their STORMCo experience.

**Shantaya Lewis:** "A passionate group of youth from Geelong Church embarked on a STORMCo trip to Warrnambool with one shared purpose: to serve the local community and honour God through every action.

The trip was organised by Caroline Debicki, who felt deeply inspired after attending a STORMCo trip in her youth. Motivated by that experience and a sense of God's calling, she set out to create a similar opportunity for youth in Geelong.

Each morning, we ran a kids club that quickly became a highlight for local children. From energetic sports games and colourful face painting to puppet shows, balloon animals, singing, and crafts - every moment was filled with joy and connection. In the afternoons, we turned our focus to practical service: cleaning the local church grounds and picking up rubbish around the community.

Although the trip was unexpectedly shortened due to unforeseen circumstances, it was undeniably

impactful. We witnessed God's goodness in so many ways and left feeling encouraged and thankful. Plans are already in motion to return in 2026, and we can't wait to see how God continues working in Warrnambool."

**Kennedy Su'a:** "STORMCo gave our young people the opportunity to live out our mission of 'Service To Others Really Matters.' From assisting with community service projects to simply being present and offering kindness, our team was able to make a genuine impact on the local community. It was a powerful reminder that even small acts of service, when done with love, can leave a lasting impression.

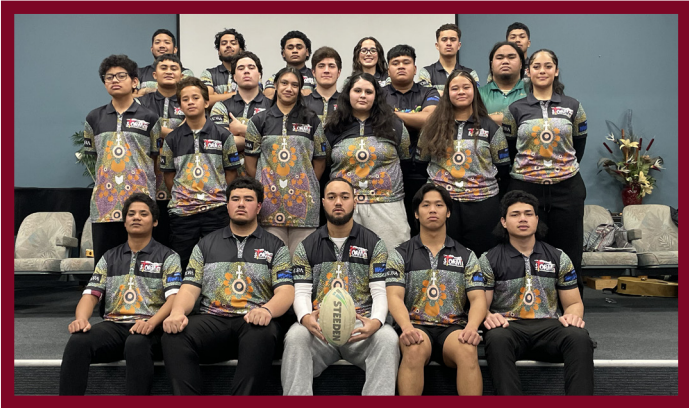
For many of our young people, this was their first experience stepping out of their comfort zone in such a meaningful way, and it has left a lasting spiritual impression on their hearts. The experience challenged our youth to grow in faith, responsibility, and teamwork. Many stepped out of their comfort zones to serve others selflessly, and they returned with a deeper understanding of what it means to follow Jesus through action. It was inspiring to witness the way God worked through each of them during the trip.

Beyond the service itself, the STORMCo trip helped build stronger bonds within our club, encouraged leadership, and deepened our Pathfinders' understanding of what it means to live a life of faith and service."

## 'From the Nile to the Nations': Evangelising at Egypt Youth Congress

On August 2, a group of twenty-five eager and expectant young adults from around Australia and New Zealand flew out to run Egypt's very first Youth Congress!

Alongside the leadership of Philip Hyland and Pr Nick Kross (the keynote speakers for the week), the group was welcomed into Cairo with a blazing temperature of forty degrees and big smiles from Egypt's youth director, Pr Girgis Malak. Months of planning and numerous late-night Zoom meetings had led to this.

After a week of exploring Egypt, learning Arabic, worshipping, and getting to know one another, we kick-started the first day of the Youth Congress. The theme: 'Let Faith Flow, from the Nile to the Nations!'

Praise God, nearly 200 young people arrived and excitedly registered for what was to be an amazing week. Our days consisted of worship, workshops, arts and crafts, and late-night summer activities from 9pm - the only part of the day where there was relief from the weather!

The Holy Spirit's presence filled the place, and the love of God shone through the entirety of our time together! The week we spent alongside Egyptian young people was unforgettable. We prayed together, worshipped together, ate together, laughed together, cried together and exchanged stories - memories which will stay in my heart forever.

As the week drew to a close, two significant events occurred. First, an altar call was made and eight young people stood forward, expressing their desire to be baptised or pursue baptismal studies. So on Sabbath, we were blessed to witness a beautiful girl, named Nymal, make the public decision to be baptised at the Congress!

Second, a call was made for missional living, prompting almost the entire room to stand. This, along with so many other moments, moved me deeply because to evangelise and live as a Christian in

the predominantly Islamic country of Egypt is no easy feat. So, the decision to stand for such a life - to live for Jesus - comes with a weight that we in Australia will never fully understand. But the power of the Lord is undeniable, and it was such an inspiring sight to behold.

From conga lining around the room singing the song 'Cast Your Burdens', to praying over one another and seeing the love shared between our team and the beautiful people of Egypt - It was bittersweet to see such a special, God-led experience come to an end.

Thank you, Jesus, for your goodness and for your undeniable presence in the country of Egypt! A part of the team's heart will remain there forever.
